IS THERE CHOICE IN WORK?

IS IT BASED ON THE CHILD'S INTEREST?

ARE THERE STORIES TO INSPIRE HIM MORALLY AND INTELLECTUALLY?

ARE EXPECTATIONS CLEARLY SET?

IS THERE DIALOGUE WITH THE CHILD IN PLANNING HIS WORK?

IS THE WORK LIMITING OR IS THERE SCOPE FOR THE CHILD TO PROCEED TILL HE WISHES?

DO THEY FEEL SUCCESSFUL IN IT, BEING ABLE TO GET IT TO COMPLETION?

IS IT UNDER OR OVER CHALLENGING?

ARE THERE RESOURCES ON THE TOPIC FOR THE CHILD TO LOOK INTO?

DOES THE CHILD PERFORM THE WHOLE CYCLE OF BEGINNING AND WINDING UP AFTER?

IS STATIONERY READILY ACCESSIBLE?

IS THERE A PLACE TO STORE HIS WORK?
